PURPLE SEAT SPOTLIGHT

HILLARY XOUMANIVONG NAMED ATHLETIC CLUB BOISE COMMUNITY IMPACT STAR



At Athletic Club Boise, the Community Impact STAR — Service, Teamwork, Accountability, and Responsibility — is symbolized by a single purple chair inside our stadium. It reflects both the eye of the falcon in our crest and the Idaho star garnet, but more importantly, it represents the people who strengthen our community in lasting ways.

During our upcoming home match on Saturday, May 2 vs. Chattanooga Red Wolves SC, Athletic Club Boise will recognize Hillary Xoumanivong, Executive Director of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Idaho, as the latest Community Impact STAR.

For Hillary, the work is grounded in a simple belief: every young person has potential, and that potential grows when someone chooses to invest in it. At Big Brothers Big Sisters of Idaho, that idea takes shape through mentorship — matching “Littles” with volunteer “Bigs,” built not on credentials or programming, but on consistency. It's less about structure and more about showing up.

That approach matters more than ever. Many young people are navigating isolation and uncertainty, but one consistent, caring adult can change that. Confidence builds, engagement improves, and a sense of belonging starts to take hold. Not through one moment, but through many.

That impact shows up in stories like Kai, a young boy who entered the program withdrawn and hesitant. Over time, through a steady relationship with his mentor, he became more confident and more open. No single turning point, just repeated time together and a consistent presence.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Idaho operates statewide, but demand continues to outpace capacity. The need is simple: more mentors, especially men, willing to give a few hours each month. The model is built around everyday connection, doing things you already enjoy, just with someone who benefits from it.

On Saturday, Hillary Xoumanivong will be recognized in the Purple Seat — a visible moment that reflects a much larger, often unseen effort. A reminder that real impact usually comes down to consistency, proximity, and time. ■
